

EU Product Standards, Regulations and Compliance – a guide for suppliers, agents and manufacturers

Introduction

Importing and selling products in the European Union (EU) is a challenging and costly experience if your business is not fully prepared. We are entering the era of the ethical investor and the 'environmentally and socially conscious consumer'. Law makers recognise this. Ever increasing legislation is having an impact on organisations all over the world. It is the responsibility of manufacturers, importers and distributors to ensure that their products comply with the EU's legal safety, sustainability and ethical standards

How do you plan to demonstrate that your products comply with the required standards and that you can show it to your customers when they want to see proof?

Three steps you need to consider

- 1) Identify the regulations that apply to your products you want to trade in the EU and the documentation that demonstrates compliance. This could impact on the manufacturing and design of your product.
- 2) Get your product tested to the relevant requirements to gain the proof of compliance required.
- 3) Consider how you will manage this evidence of compliance the test certificate to ensure that you can always demonstrate that your product's compliance is always up to date, and that you are ready for changes or introduction of new legislation.

EU market access

Product compliance to enable access to European Union (EU) markets will be required for both market entry and acceptance.

Market Entry

To gain access for your products to the European Union (EU) market you will need to:

- Identify the legal requirements that apply to your product(s).
- Create a Product Technical File so that you can provide documentary evidence of compliance for all applicable testing and declarations in an easily accessible manner

Market Acceptance

Meeting the minimum product quality requirements in many cases may be sufficient. Some large EU retailer and industrial businesses, however, also require evidence of compliance with additional voluntary standards that demonstrate higher levels of product quality.

An example of this is the 'GS Mark' testing procedure which is conducted by trusted test houses. Another example applies to wooden products that are FSC or PEFC certified. These are extra qualities that are added to a product. If you cannot easily demonstrate compliance to your potential customers, they will be concerned that your goods could be refused customs clearance when placed for the first time on the EU market.



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There are huge opportunities for profitable trade with EU buyers, but failing to meet your compliance obligations could be extremely costly and could result in serious damage to your brand. An example of this is given below.

Product Recall Example:



Product Type: Battery Charger

Product Description: Black plastic adaptor in a blue cardboard box.

Compliance Issue: product does not comply with the requirements of the Low Voltage Directive and

the relevant European Standard EN 60335.

Risk: Fire risk (serious).

Action taken: Return of goods to port of origin for reworking or disposal (by importer).

Is your product ready for the EU market?

Below is a simple set of questions to help exporters to the EU think through the compliance issues.

Do you have a good knowledge of the compliance requirements for your product(s) before selling in to the EU?	
Are you aware of all relevant Declarations that require completing to cover your product(s)?	
Are you aware of EU approval/certification marks applied to your product(s) packaging/instruction manual/the product?	
Has your product been certified by an accredited test house?	
Do you have a system to store a Product Technical File for your product(s) accessible to regulatory EU authorities or potential EU buyers?	
Do you have a system that ensures your Product Technical File is kept up-to-date and incorporates changes to EU legislation? EU legislation is being constantly updated.	
Do you have compliance experts in EU standards to ensure your Product Technical Files are relevant?
